*The bottom of the Airstrip borders the stream*

*Airstrip runs 400m (fence to fence) from East to West*

*Eastern half of airstrip is on a medium slope*

*RH circuit, takeoff/landing direction is East to West*

### **By Road:**

*From Taupiri, turn onto Gordonton Rd*

*A few hundred meters later, turn left onto Orini Rd*

*About 8km later, turn left onto McConnell Rd*

*Follow the road until you see aircraft!*
